Keynote Speaker



Rick Bragg won the Pulitzer Prize for Feature Writing in 1996 for his work at *The New York Times*. Born in Piedmont, Alabama, Bragg is the author of two best-selling memoirs, *All Over But the Shoutin'* and *Ava's Man*, as well as his newest release *The Prince of Frogtown*.

He became a domestic correspondent in *The New York Times*' Atlanta office in October 1994. Before joining *The New York Times* he worked at several newspapers, including *The Los Angeles Times* and the *St. Petersburg Times*.

Bragg attended Harvard University as a Nieman Fellow from 1992 to 1993 as well as Jacksonville State University. In addition to his Pulitzer Prize, he

is the recipient of the American Society of Newspaper Editors Distinguished Writing Award and 31 other national, regional and state writing awards. He has had stories included in Best Newspaper Writing 1991, Best of the Press 1988, and two journalism textbooks on good writing and foreign reporting.

Bragg has taught writing at Harvard University, the Poynter Institute for Media Studies, Boston University, the University of South Florida, and other colleges. He now works as a writing professor at The University of Alabama's journalism program in its College of Communications and Information Sciences.



He served as President of Parkland College in Champaign, Illinois and as the Vice President for Academic Affairs at Iowa Western Community College in Council Bluffs, Iowa. He also held a variety of administrative positions with Miami-Dade College.



Dr. Perry Ward, President, Lawson State Community College - Dr. Ward received a B.A. from Miles College, and both a M.S.W. and a Ph.D. from The University of Alabama. Dr. Ward began his career in education as a teacher for the Birmingham Urban League and also served as an adjunct professor for The University of Alabama. Dr. Rudolph S. Jackson, Vice-President, Commission on Colleges, Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Prior to his appointment with the Commission, Dr. Jackson served as a professor and Graduate Dean, at North Carolina Central University in Durham, NC. During his tenure at NCCU, he served a two-year term as Chair of the Faculty Senate. As part of his research focus, Dr. Jackson teamed with colleagues at the University of Massachusetts at Amherst to secure a multi-year \$2.5 million dollar grant to target smoking reduction activities in African-American communities. Dr. Jackson also completed a fellowship with the Accrediting Commission for Health Services Administration, and held funded research fellowships with the Sheps Center for Health Services Research and the Lineberger Cancer Center both in Chapel Hill. He received his MBA and doctorate degrees from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.



Dr. Jerry Ingram, Professor Emeritus, Auburn University Montgomery and President of Southeast Research Dr. Ingram received his Ph.D. in Marketing from the University of Arkansas. His professional interests include research activities in areas such as economic impact analyses, public opinion research, and marketing program assessments. He has provided consulting services to a number of public and private organizations such as the Alabama Medicaid Agency, Great Southern Wood, American Association of Manufacturers, and the Alabama Department of Corrections. He has also provided expert testimonies in a number of litigation disputes that includes: breach of contract, antitrust, trademark infringement, and a disputed labor union election.




